

Jaguar Projects have been instructed by Knight Frank to complete the Central Plant Replacement at The Heights, Weybridge, Surrey. The project will circa £1.3m for phase 1, with the remaining phases 2 & 3 to come online at a later stage (circa £2.6m). A huge congratulations to the Projects team on securing this win!

As well as retaining an existing portfolio of buildings, we also secured several large tenant contracts and One Crown Place. This is 3 mixed use buildings, including 246 residential apartments and 13,000 m² of office space, in the

'A Day in the life of' Sam Potter

Site Manager at One Knightsbridge Green

We had a chat with Site Manager, Sam and the team at One Knightsbridge Green. Sam gave us an insight into his day, and we got to know the team onsite a little better.

How did you get into the building services industry?

I started my career as an Apprentice for a data company doing electrical works. I stayed with them for around 5 years and learnt a lot whilst I was there. I then went on to work at a maintenance company who looked after

schools in Hackney. From there, I went to work for CBRE which was my first official maintenance role. So through the electrical route I ended up in maintenance. I am really enjoying it at Jaguar so far and I have learnt a lot working for the company, it's been a really good experience so far!

What is a typical day for you?

My day is never typical, it can range from being in the office in front of the PC compiling AW quotes, to fixing faulty boilers, AHU's and motors. It's a real mix and myself and the team take each day as it comes!

What do you enjoy most about your job?

I would say I enjoy the technical side of the job the most – so getting stuck in and trying to fix things. If a pump fails, I strip it down and figure out how it works and what's gone wrong and then put it all back together.

On a recent shutdown we got a fault from the Generator Changeover Switch, so we had to carry out a full investigation. From that, we had to create a new Changeover Switch Panel. I really enjoyed doing that! We had to take the old schematics, get all the new parts we were installing and create new schematics for it. We also connected all of the changeover controls on the new panel we were installing prior to Jaguar's Technical Team coming in to assist with the repairs.



Citypoint has several large tenants including Simmons & Simmons, SquarePoint Capital, Flextrade, Seyfarth Shaw, United Trust Bank and Winston and Strawn Property. There is a separate team that look after the tenant contracts in the building.

Built in 1967, the building is one of the largest in the City and was subject to a comprehensive reconstruction in 2001. The onsite M&E services are experiencing an injection of capital, with major refurbishments of the Cooling Towers, Water systems, Fire Alarm and BMS Controls to bring the aged systems back up to a good standard. The team have done an excellent job in supporting the contractors carrying out project works.

Starting his career at Jaguar working at Lloyd's of London, he has done some great fabrication work on the cages located within their workshop (pictured bottom right), and has also built bespoke storage solutions. The majority of this work would have required a subcontractor had Martin not been part of Jaguar.

Moving forward, Martin will be working across all Jaguar contracts that require mechanical work including pumps, motors, fans, pipe work, bellows, valves and fabrication.

So why do we need Martin's expertise in the business?

There are a number of reasons that Martin's work is especially useful across our buildings. For labour only accounts where we provide

all additional works as chargeable extras, we're now able to offer our customers better value for money by delivering the works 'in house' utilising Martin's skillset, rather than subcontracting works at premium rates.

As many of you will already know, there is always a need for highly skilled mechanical engineers in the building services industry. Jaguar looked at the amount of revenue spent as a company with mechanical contractors, and as you can imagine with the number of buildings we look after - it was pretty high! We decided that we needed someone to cover a proportion of this internally, and through using Martin, the benefits are not only financial, but also reputational. Martin has done a brilliant job on the works he has carried out so far.

How do you perform Adult CPR?

The sudden collapse of footballer Christian Eriksen's during the 2020 Euro's is a strong reminder that a cardiac arrest can strike anyone, anywhere, anytime and without warning. Christian aged only 29, collapsed on the field during a match between Denmark and Finland, it was soon confirmed that he had in fact suffered a cardiac arrest and was indeed resuscitated on the pitch. If someone suffers a cardiac arrest, it's vital they receive immediate

CPR and defibrillation to give them the best chance of survival. Every second counts – the more of us that know how to perform CPR, the more lives that can be saved.

Vitality Champion Jenny Graham completes 30k!




